Well, it took us a whole year to paint and fix the problems that we discovered. The interior is about finished, with Dave Wasson taking out the stained carpet in the dining room and installing a new wood grained laminate floor. Thank you to Dave and everyone else who worked so hard on the Parsonage this year.

Our other responsibility is to our renter, Diane Del Priore, and the Norlin House. Diane told us months ago that the refrigerator in the house wasn't working properly but she'd replace it and take the replacement with her when she eventually moved. She'd received one from a friend but it developed problems and she is again in need of a new fridge. Since she now cannot afford a new one, the church bought a new one which will stay with the house. It is a 20 cu ft Whirlpool from Lowe's. Total cost was \$804 which included delivery and hauling away of old one. She is very happy with it!

Next on the list for the Norlin House is to replace a couple of broken window panes and also some kitchen cabinets that had developed toxic mold problems. Hopefully those issues will be addressed this month.

On Sunday, July 31, we will have a Church Council meeting to finalize the budget, which will include the changes to the Pastor's salary. We will also be discussing how we will be using the Parsonage in the coming year and what programs we can safely resume or begin, even though there are many COVID cases still around in our county. We have many new ideas and hope you will be excite to take part in these new programs. Please remember to wear your masks during church services and other activities. Let's keep each other safe.
